#### Farm Safety Program

Ray Hoppins, our former associate superintendent, was at JDES on January 24th and 27th and delivered the Farm Safety Program. This initiative introduces age-appropriate farm safety topics, including:

- Safe play areas
- Water and ice safety
- Quad and dirt bike safety
- Machinery and livestock safety
- Hearing safety
- Personal responsibility

We are excited to host educational presentations in the coming weeks:

No Secrets Presentation In February, we welcome the Central Alberta Sexual Assault Support Centre back for their "No Secrets" presentation. This program is tailored for children in Pre-K through Grade 3 and focuses on personal safety as a preventive skill against child sexual abuse. Topics include:

- Public vs. private: treating public and private things with kindness.
- Body awareness: understanding private parts (including correct names).
- Personal autonomy: learning that bodies are private, and children have the right to decide if they want to give a hug or a high-five.
- Safe and unsafe touching.
- Safe and unsafe secrets.
- Personal safety rules: "Say no, go, and tell a trusted adult."
- Boundaries: reinforcing that no one should look at, touch, or take pictures of our bodies without permission.
- Safety network: identifying trusted adults children can turn to for help.

Please note that this presentation does not involve discussions about child sexual abuse, sexual violence, or sexual health education. It is also not connected to lessons or concepts in the SOGI curriculum. 
